


February 5 - PUSHOUT SCREENING AT GLENFIELD

This Wednesday, Teachers Undoing Racism Now (TURN) of Montclair hosted a viewing of the film *Pushout: The Criminalization of Black Girls in Schools.* The film focuses on the educational, judicial, and societal disparities facing Black girls. These disparities often lead to excessive punitive discipline that disrupts their education. Audience members were encouraged to view the film through the lens of a Montclair resident. After the film, audience members engaged in a powerful conversation regarding the issues of race and equity in the Montclair Public School district.

## February 13 – POMPTONIAN FEEDBACK COMMITTEE MEETING


Managers from Pomptonian, our district's food service company, will meet with staff and students from different grade levels and lunch periods to gather feedback about the quality of their food and customer service.
